

A Stations of the Cross Pilgrimage

As Christianity grew, Christians throughout the world would travel, often on foot, to the holy sites in Jerusalem and the surrounding area. They went to remember the sacred events that led up to the Crucifixion and Resurrection of Jesus.

However, not all Christians were able to travel to the Holy Land on a pilgrimage. It was for them that the Stations of the Cross were begun. These fourteen pictures, each depicting one scene from Jesus' journey to Calvary, are displayed on the inside walls of churches or are built outdoors along the pathways of parish grounds or retreat houses. Now everyone can make a pilgrimage by walking from station to station, recalling Jesus' final hours on Earth.
